BASEBALL

Program Fact Sheet

The following should answer some of the most frequently asked questions about SCCC baseball:

1. We compete in Region III of the National Junior College Athletic Association. We are one of 20 schools that have baseball programs in Region III.
2. We also compete in the Mountain Valley Conference. Member schools that play baseball are: SUNY Cobleskill, Fulton-Montgomery CC, Herkimer County CC, Hudson Valley CC, Adirondack CC, Columbia Greene CC and Mohawk Valley CC. SCCC has won the MVC championship four of the last ten years.
3. We play both a fall and spring schedule. Our fall season consists of 15-20 games; in the spring we play 40-45 games, which includes a spring trip to Florida.
4. Our indoor workouts take place at the All Stars Academy in Latham . We utilize gym space, indoor batting cages, indoor mounds, and pitching machines. We welcome your visit to our indoor workouts commencing in February.
5. Our outdoor workouts take place on our baseball field located behind the Begley Building on the west side of campus. You are more than welcome to attend any practice session.
6. Home games are played on Campus Field. This year's schedule is available through the athletic office and on the SCCC Athletic web page at sunysccc.edu
7. SCCC has an open admissions policy. However, student/athletes must maintain a 2.00 grade point average to be able to compete athletically on the intercollegiate level.
8. The Admissions Office is the sole judge of whether or not a student is admitted to the college.
9. Financial aid is available to the student/athlete. Aid is awarded through, and determined by, our Financial Aid Office.
10. The tuition in effect for the 2009-2010 academic year is \$3,150. Room and board are not offered on campus. However, we can direct you to the person who can assist you in finding off-campus housing.

11. A visit to campus is recommended. With an appointment, our baseball staff will discuss with you any questions you may have about the baseball program and/or the college.
