"We had one building, Elston Hall, the former Van Curler Hotel, with a rose garden where the cafeteria and Elston Student Center are today," he said. "There was also a 10-week quarter system under the cooperative education model (students in every discipline had to work in their major for 10 weeks and earn academic credit)."

Cynthia Decker has been named Direc-


tor of Financial Aid. Cynthia started








Smart Scholars start their college careers

Four years ago, not only did Khulwanttee Singh begin her first year at Schenectady High School; she also was part of the inaugural group of students in Smart Scholars, an innovative program and partnership between SCCC and the Schenectady City School District.

While she was still in high school, Khul-wanttee and dozens of other students took college classes. She was a member of the first group of Smart Scholars to graduate from high school in June and go on to college.



She chose to attend SCCC this semester, coming in already hav-

ing credits after taking speech, first year seminar and a science class during her summer breaks throughout high school.

She's majoring in Science and plans to transfer after SCCC to pursue a career in marine biology. "I love the ocean," she said in between classes last week. "It's astonishing that people know more about the stars than the waters right in front of them. It's just so big and so vast and stretches on for miles."

Khulwanttee keeps in touch with the other Smart Scholars, a tight-knit group who started together at King Magnet Middle School in Schenectady and learned about Smart Scholars from their guidance counselor while they were in eighth grade. Some are at SCCC now or attending other local colleges and even in the Air Force.

Khulwanttee reflects on getting her start with Smart Scholars this way, "My dreams were the moon and Smart Scholars has given me the rocket."


